

## **Disability Resource Center Rights and Responsibilities**

## **Student Rights and Responsibilities**

Every student with a documented disability has the following rights:

- 1. Equal access to the college, its programs, services and facilities.
- 2. Reasonable accommodations and auxiliary aids.
- 3. Confidentiality of their disability-related records.
- 4. Access to their disability-related records.

Every student with a documented disability has the following responsibilities:

- 1. Meet the pre-requisite and essential functions for the program in which they have applied.
- 2. Initiate a request for disability services through the Disability Resource Center in a timely manner.
- 3. Provide documentation of their disability from an appropriate professional source that verifies the nature of the disability, functional limitations, and the need for specific accommodations.
- 4. Initiate a request for specific accommodations and follow the proper procedures for obtaining them.

## **Institutional Rights and Responsibilities**

Berkshire Community College, through its Disability Resource Center, has the <u>right</u> to:

- 1. Maintain the College's academic standards.
- 2. Request appropriate documentation from a student and determine his/her eligibility for services

- 3. Determine, in consultation with the student, reasonable accommodations and/or auxiliary aids and services.
- 4. Deny the request for accommodation if the documentation does not support it.
- 5. Refuse to provide an accommodation and/or auxiliary aid if it fundamentally alters the nature of a course or program or if it poses:
  - A direct threat to the health and safety of others.
  - An undue financial or administrative burden on the College.

Berkshire Community College, through its Disability Resource Center, has the <u>responsibility</u> to:

- 1. Ensure that the College does not discriminate in the recruitment, admission, or treatment of students with disabilities.
- 2. Ensure that the academic program is accessible to the greatest extent possible by all students with disabilities.
- 3. Have a clearly established grievance procedure for persons with disabilities who feel their rights have been violated under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- 4. Maintain appropriate confidentiality of records and communication concerning students with disabilities except where disclosure is required by law or authorized by the student.
- 5. Make reasonable modifications in policies, practices, and procedures as necessary to avoid discrimination on the basis of disability.
- 6. Provide reasonable modifications, accommodations, or auxiliary aids to qualified students within a reasonable time frame
